

THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS County of Sacramento

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1993 Sacramento County Crop Report. The 1993 production value was \$228,651,000 a slight decrease from the previous year.

Milk continues to lead Sacramento County commodities with a value of \$35,178,000. This is a very slight decrease from last years value due to a reduction in milk prices.

Pear production remains strong with a total value for the crop of \$33,720,000. Pears lead all other crop categories as Sacramento County continues to lead the state in pear production. Wine grape production suffered somewhat in 1993 with reduced yields as a result of disease problems brought on by late rains. Seventy three hundred acres of wine had production valued at \$18,396,000. Although this is a 15% reduction from the previous year, values are expected to bounce back in 1994 as yields improve in what continues to be a strong market.

Field crop leaders for Sacramento County continue to be Corn and Rice at \$12.7 and \$7.6 million respectfully. Safflower acreage increased by 9,400 acres in response to a strong market and production of 26,640 tons had a gross value of \$7,859,000.

The values reported are gross values and in no way reflect income to the producer. There are a variety of production and marketing costs, not a part of this report, that must be considered when attempting to calculate income.

I would like to express my thanks to the producers of Sacramento County who provided the information for this report. I also appreciate the efforts of my staff, particularly Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, Keith Miller, for compiling, and producing this report.

ORGANIC FARMING

There is limited Certified Organic Farming activity in Sacramento County. However, many local growers for the Sacramento Certified Farmers Markets produce fruit and vegetables using no chemical pest control and depend entirely on organic farming methods. Most, if not all, of our commercial producers of agricultural commodities use recognized integrated pest management techniques in their farming operations.
