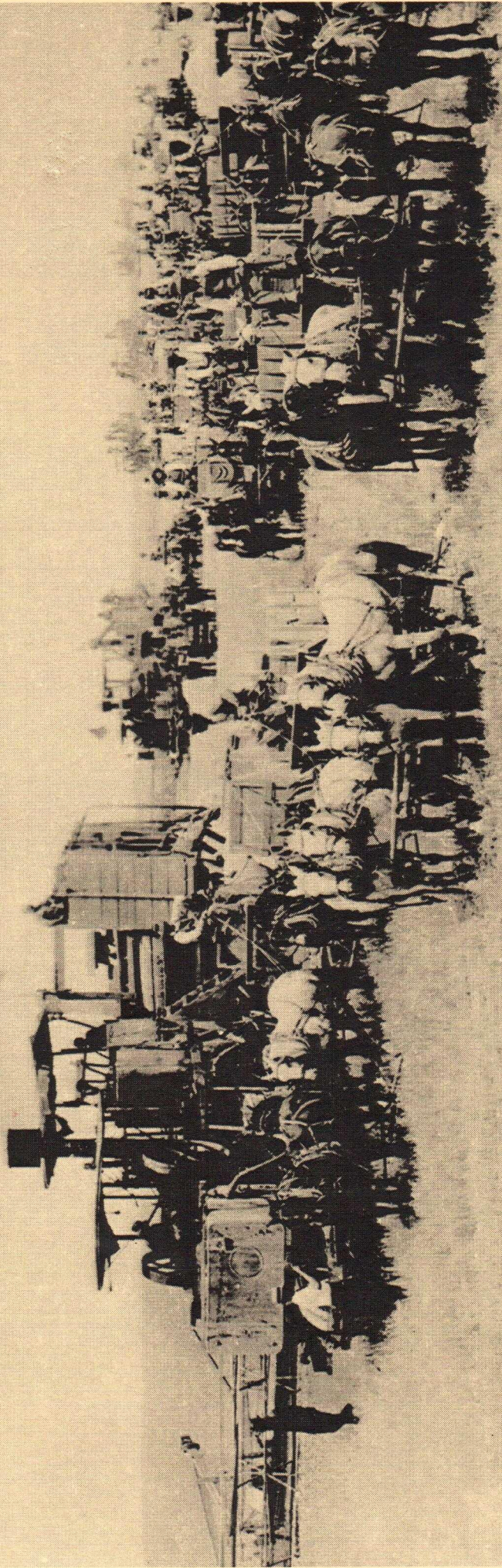

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1994 Sacramento County Crop Report. The 1994 production value was \$231,163,000 a slight increase from the previous year.


Milk continues to lead Sacramento County commodities with a value of \$37,002,000. This is a slight increase from last years value due to slightly improved production and slight increase in price.

Pear production remains strong with a total value for the crop of \$32,844,000. Pears continue to lead all other crop categories as Sacramento County continues to lead the state in pear production. Yield was effected somewhat this year due to hail damage which severely reduced production in some orchards.

The values reported are gross values and in no way reflect income to the producer. There are a variety of production and marketing costs, not a part of this report, that must be considered when attempting to calculate income.

I would like to express my thanks to the producers of Sacramento County who provided the information for this report. I also appreciate the efforts of my staff, particularly Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, Keith Miller, for compiling, and producing this report.
